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Kindergarten - Aceves

November will begin with a week of activities learning the origins of the two days Mexicans and Mexican Americans remember their deceased loved ones: Día de los Muertos. This is part of our Social Studies, SEL, and enrichment curriculum. In our dialogue circle, we discuss the loss of loved ones and the children's apprehension about the topic.

This month we hope to achieve the goal of our students being able to recognize words base on the initial letter sound in combination with other letter sounds in the word that distinguish it from other words on a list with the same first letter. This phonetic skill is one of several that is key to reading.

In Science, we are hoping to harvest the radishes we planted in late September. Daily observations (along with watering) have allowed us to see these tiny plants sprout as the weather cools.

In Math, we are on our way to mastering single digit addition, quantity recognition up to 20 in both base-10 and base-20, learning our basic 2D geometric shapes and distinguishing them from their 3D counterparts.

Finally, by the end of this month we will have learned the beginning steps of Aztec Dancing and one of its sets (as part of our Physical Education and Enrichment components).

What We Are Learning.

Language Arts: Resource (Heggerty) to practice Onset Fluency, Isolating Final Sounds, and Adding. Comparison and contrast of Halloween and Day of Death (discussion or charts.) Writing: Using correct grammar for example the students are using capital letters and ending in a punctuation mark. Write: What is the problem of the story and how it was solved. Recall the story: Write the story in sequence with details and illustrate.

Math: Students will use understanding of addition and subtraction facts to build groups of related facts, or "fact families."Students will use Two-step word problems with all operations Computations and Algebraic Thinking – Multi-digit Addition and Subtraction Word Problems Students will use visual representations to practice representing numbers in standard form and expanded form.

Science: Students will draw a Monarch butterfly life cycle. They will write about the mariposas monarcas and where they migrate.

- In **math**, we will continue to work on some number talks. For the next couple of weeks we will work on addition and subtraction and converting into simple multiplication. We will be working hard on story problems and making sure we know the information we need and get rid of the information we don't need.

- In **Science** students will continue to hypothesize and ask questions. We have been working on anchor phenomenon lessons to deepen what the students are learning within the lesson. We will continue to journal what types of questions we have and slowly come back to see if through exploration we can answer them. Within these next two weeks we will finish up the unit on climate and weather and move into life cycles.
- In **Physical Education** students will be moving around and exercising their bodies. We will talk about the importance of healthy life styles and how to make sure we are keeping healthy.
